Self assess for projects >\$20m

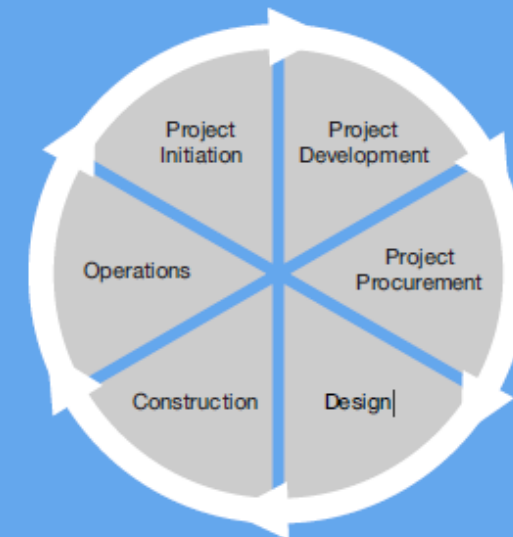
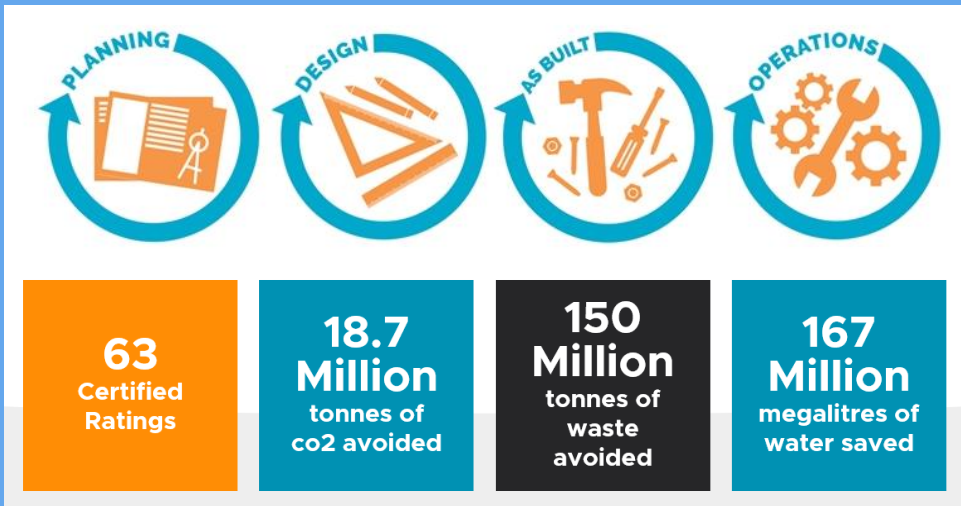
- 10 projects internally assessed

Road to re-use

- Supporting Waste Strategy 2030
- Target to increase use of C&D to 75% by 2020
- New Recycled Construction Products Program Specification
- Pilot projects underway
 - Crushed Recycled Concrete (CRC).
 - Seeking to use 25 000 tonnes on Kwinana Freeway widening and MRIA Projects
 - Crumbed Rubber Modified Asphalt
 - Currently use 140,000 car tyres pa
 - Trial to increase usage in asphalt to enable facility to be created in WA
 - Main Roads looking to double our usage
 - Glass fines trial – Kwinana Freeway



Aboriginal Engagement

- 2018 State Government Aboriginal Procurement Plan
- Created an Executive Aboriginal Employment Initiatives Taskforce
- On track to exceed mandated targets
 - 8% of contracts awarded to Aboriginal businesses
- Incorporated mandatory requirements and incentives in contracts
- New Regional Maintenance contracts include incentives and drivers
- 13 Aboriginal clerical and technical trainees employed
