Will Hodgman is Tasmania's 45th Premier. Will was born and educated in Hobart, Tasmania. He graduated in Arts and Law at the University of Tasmania in 1993 and was admitted as a Barrister and Solicitor of the Supreme Court of Tasmania in 1994. In 1995, Will worked in the United Kingdom with the Wiltshire County Council, prosecuting cases of child abuse and neglect. He entered Parliament in 2002 and became Leader of the Liberal Party and State Opposition in 2006.
